We are four staff members and we care for 40 children in 2 classes: Trina the Kindergarten Teacher, Eyakhe the Playgroup Teacher, Nzali the teacher assistant and office manager and Nolupho the cook and cleaner.

In July we celebrated the Winter Festival. The teachers presented a table play which the children enjoyed. Then we went for a walk with the parents around Masiphumelele Township and around the fire singing songs and holding our lanterns.

We had a work-party where parents and all the teacher's came together to spring clean the preschool. Even the children helped with gardening and watering the plants.

The children went on two outings. In Tokai Forest the children collected pinecones and other treasures. At Cape Point they climbed to the lighthouse and look far out to sea. How wonderful to enjoy a picnic lunch in nature.

We celebrate birthdays and each birthday child chooses angles for the day. Parents bring a cake and juice for the children and something for the teachers also. The children enjoy their special day.

Over the last 6 months 14 post graduates were able in a supportive environment to develop various clients, making orders for anything from bags over men's shirts to dresses and they were finally earning their own money. Students had free use of the sewing machines, access to coaching, therapy, poverty stoplight assessments and business and sewing skills mentoring.
